

Categories for 2011 Quilt Show – Judged Entries

- Please carefully consider the appropriate category for your quilt. We reserve the option to make adjustments as necessary
- No quilts made from kits will be allowed.
- All items must be quilted, made predominantly of fabric, finished, clean and in good condition. The only tied or denim quilts that will be accepted are those made by youth quilters or which are new crazy quilts.
- Categories will be divided by the intended use as bed quilts or wall quilts.
- Each entrant will be limited to two entries in each category.
- Prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the judges for; 1st Place; 2nd Place; 3rd Place; and Honorable Mention
- Additional prizes will be Viewers Choice; Best of Show; Judges Choice; and the Special Merit Awards listed below.

Appliqué—Quilts made primarily using appliqué techniques. Hand and machine appliqué will be separate categories.

Art/ Innovative—Quilts made from original or non-traditional designs with an emphasis on design innovation and skill in the use of color, fabric, image, shape or paint. This would include quilts that are heavily embellished.

Pieced—Quilts made primarily with standard piecing techniques, including paper piecing. *Quilts will be divided by those made entirely by one person and those made by two or more.*

Miniature—Quilts with a perimeter up to and no larger than 100 inches that are a scaled-down version of a larger quilt design.

Mixed Techniques—Quilts that incorporate a fairly even amount of two or more techniques or styles (piecing and appliqué, for example) to develop the design of the top. *Quilts will be divided by those made entirely by one person and those made by two or more.*

Other—Includes wearable, home decorating items, bags, etc.

Youth Quilter—Quilts made by a person under the age of 18. Please include the age of the youth on the entry form; this category may be divided by age (under 12 and 13-18)

Computerized Work—A quilt where any part of the quilt is accomplished by a computerized embroidery and/or quilting machine.

Special Merit Awards

Rookie—Quilts made entirely by an individual who has been quilting less than two years.

Longarm Showcase—Quilts will be judged with a strong emphasis on the skill and originality of the longarm quilter. Only hand-guided work will be accepted.

Hand Quilting Showcase—Quilt will be judged with a strong emphasis on the skill and originality of the hand quilter.
